- 3. With at least two (2) experience in the said field

- 5. Must hold a permanent appointment
- 6. Must be proficient in written and spoken English.
- 7. In good health, both physically and mentally (pregnancy is a disqualifying condition)
- 8. Age limit: 50 years old and below.
